

Wish List Items for Rabbits:

Because rabbits can often become easily bored in their cages, providing them with toys that can be tossed around, chewed upon and dug into provides them with much needed physical and mental stimulation. The rule of thumb for purchasing toys for rabbits is that the plastic must be hard. If you can crush a plastic toy with your hand, a rabbit can crush it with its teeth and it is not a safe toy for the rabbit.
